Life originated in the early seas less than a billion years after the Earth was formed. Yet another three billion years were to pass before the first plants and animals appeared on the continents. Life's transition from the sea to the land was perhaps as much evolutionary challenge as was the origin of life.

What forms of life were able to make such a serious change in lifestyle? The traditional view of the first terrestrial organisms is based on mega fossils - relatively large specimens of essentially whole plants and animal. In this view, prehistoric vascular plants first colonized the margins of continental waters, followed by animals that fed on the plants, and lastly by animals that hunt on the plant - eater . Moreover, the mega fossils suggest that terrestrial life appeared and diversified explosively near the boundary between the silurian and the Devonian periods, a little more than 400 million years ago.

Recently, however, researchers have been taking a closer look at the sediments below this silurian - Devonian geological boundary, and they have uncovered new evidence from sediments that were deposited near the shores of the ancient oceans - plant microfossils and microscopic pieces of small animals. These newly discovered fossils have not only showed the existence of previously unknown organisms, but have also pushed back these dates for the attack of land by multicellular organisms.

Our views about the nature of the early plant and animal communities are now revised. And with those revisions come new speculations about the first terrestrial life - forms.

Mental and physical health professionals may consider referring clients and patients to a music therapist for a number of reasons. It seems a particularly good choice for social worker who is coordinating a client's case. Music therapists use music to establish a relationship with the patient and to improve the patient's health, using highly structured musical interactions. Patients and therapists may sing, play instruments, dance, compose, or simply listen to music. The course of training for music therapists is comprehensive. In addition to formal musical and therapy training, music therapists are taught to discern what kinds of interventions will be most beneficial for each individual patient. Because each patient is different and has different goals, the music therapist must be able to understand the patient's situation and choose the music and activities that will do the most toward helping the patient achieve his or her goals. Thousands of years ago, the ancient people of Babylon and Egypt studied the stars in the sky. From their research, they came up with the zodiac, a map of the sun, moon, stars, and planets. It was first used to keep track of time. These ancient astrologers studied the constellations (a pattern made by stars in the sky) and their positions in the sky. They wanted to know when each constellation was closest to the sun. They used this information to determine where each group of stars belongs in the zodiac.

Today, some people believe that the zodiac can be used to describe a person's personality. Some also believe that by studying the zodiac, they can predict what will happen in the future. According to these beliefs, a person's zodiac sign is connected to his or her birth date.

The zodiac has remained the same for over a thousand years. It is divided up into 12 equal parts, each associated with a star sign. However, some astrologers are suggesting a change. This is because the way the Earth goes around has changed little by little over the centuries, which has also changed its path around the sun. Book clubs are a great way to meet new friends or keep touch with old ones, while keeping up on your reading and participating in lively and intellectually energizing discussions. If you're interested in starting a book club, you should consider the following options and advice.

The first thing you'll need is a group of members. Before registration, think carefully about how many people you want to participate and also what the club's focus or interest will be. For example, some book clubs focus only on fiction, other read nonfiction. Some are even more specific, focusing only on a particular genre such as mysteries, science fiction, or romance. Others have a more flexible and open focus. All of these possibilities can make for a great club, but it is important to decide on a focus at the beginning, so the guidelines will be clear to the group and future members.

After setting the basic parameters, recruitment can begin. Tell your friends and family, advertise in the local newspaper, and hang flyers on bulletin boards in local stores, colleges, libraries, and bookstores. When enough people express interest, schedule a start meeting during which decisions will be made about specific guidelines that will ensure the club runs smoothly. The earth is getting smaller, at least when we talk about languages. More and more people speak the three most common languages: English, Spanish and Mandarin. In fact, people are forgetting their local languages. In many parts of the world, grandparents speak a language their grandchildren don't understand. As cultures adjust to these changes, and languages aren't taught to children or spoken at home, these local languages are slowly gone away. A language is said to be in trouble when less than about thirty three percent of children in the society speak it. Then it is considered a dying language.

Why keep our language alive? Languages hold the key to understanding a culture's beliefs and values. They show how a culture understands or explains the world. "You need to look at a variety of languages because there is no single language that gets it all", said Dr. Linda Cumberland who is working to save Assiniboine, a Native American language.
